On behalf of the Washington State Hospital Association, we thank you for the opportunity to comment on the nursing assistant rulemaking. We appreciate your consideration and intent to make technical corrections to WAC 246-841A-405, to incorporate recently approved language in the concurrent rulemaking WSR 23-02-037 related to nurse delegation of glucose testing and monitoring. Specifically:

- 1. Moving reference to WAC 246-840-910 through 970 from WAC 246-841A-405(2)(b) to subsection 3, as these requirements are specific to in-home and community-based settings; and
- 2. Ensuring WAC 246-841A-405(2)(d) mirrors statutory language in RCW 18.79.260.

Chapter 246-841A-405 Proposed Non-substantive Changes

These non-substantive changes to rules filed as WSR 23-15-091 on July 18, 2023, with the Washington State Code Reviser's Office were proposed by interested parties prior to the hearing on August 30, 2023, at 2 pm. The changes make technical corrections.
