



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<u>Guidelines for the selection of clinical sites:</u> The Nursing Program Curriculum Committee and faculty plan to conduct a comprehensive review of clinical experiences in the program as well as selection of clinical sites in Spring 2021.

Clinical site student and faculty evaluations aggregated and trended over time: At this time, student evaluations of clinical sites are returned directly to the clinical sites. Our major clinical site has requested "Weekly Communicators" completed by faculty that allow timely communication of problems and kudos for staff who have helped the students. They no longer want us to do end of quarter evaluations of the units except for preceptorship. Future clinical site student evaluations are under discussion (we have not been happy with the survey used in the past). We plan to include an agenda item at each end of quarter faculty meeting to evaluate clinical sites.

The students felt that Live Simulation did better prepare them in all domains and when V Sim was mentioned it was better than not having any SIM but live SIM was preferred."
