#### Background



Washington is changing the process for completing the nursing assistant exam



The purpose of change is to increase students' access to skills testing following graduation



The Washington State Board of Nursing (WABON) has been working closely with Credentia and nursing assistant training programs to developed and launch the new process

## Notes on September





Skills test dates scheduled within the month of September are not affected by the changes



Testing candidates should keep September testing appointments



You can continue to register for skills and written test openings within the month of September as usual

#### **Changes for October**

- Graduates beginning their testing process will take the <u>SKILLS TEST FIRST</u>
- Graduates will be expected to pass the skills test before registering for the written test

 This change will save steps and time in testing and certification processes



#### **Changes for October**

Many approved nursing assistant training programs will schedule and provide skills tests for their current and previous graduates at the program.

- The list of the programs ready to provide skills testing to their graduates can be found here
- Many additional programs will begin in November or December to expand availability further
- By 2024, we expect most programs will provide skills testing routinely immediately after graduation

Here comes a REALLY BIG change for October ...



## Registration for the Skills Test

• Graduates will no longer register for skills tests on Credentia 365

- However, graduates will continue to use Credentia 365 to:
  - Get their Candidate Identification (ID) number
  - Register for the written (or oral) test

## Washington Graduates' Eligibility Codes

 These four steps apply to these Credentia Eligibility Codes:

o **E1**: New Nursing Assistant (graduate of a traditional training program)

○**E6:** Alternative Nursing Assistant (HCA or MA Bridge program graduate)





Other eligible candidates will use the same 4 steps, but in a different order and will be addressed later in this presentation:

- E2: Nursing Program Student or Graduate (LPN or RN program)
- **E3**: Military Nursing Student
- E4: OUT-of-STATE Nursing Assistant Graduate or Nursing Program Student or Graduate
- o **E5**: Lapsed Nursing Assistant
- o **E7**: Trained Prior to Feb. 1, 2015
- E8: OBRA Re-Activation

o **E9**: Training Program Now Closed


















## Why is STEP 1 Important?

- **STEP 1** is important because you need a Candidate ID# to:
  - Register for the skills test
  - Register for the written (or oral) test
  - Assure your passing results are quickly processed for credentialing and employment purposes
























#### The Exam Cost is the Same, <u>BUT</u> ...

#### There is a shift in amounts paid for each part of the exam:

- Starting Oct. 1, the skills test fee will go down by \$10 while the written (or oral) test fee will go up by \$10
- This means the skills test fee will be \$100, and the written (or oral) testing fee will be \$55
- The purpose of this change is to assure quick linkage of your passing scores on both parts of the exam for efficient credentialing and transition to employment







## MAJOR CHANGE for TEST DAY

If you are taking your skills test at any location other than the program where you graduated:

- You must bring your Certificate of Completion in order to test
- o If you are testing through the E-2 through E-5 or the E-7 Eligibility Route, then you will need to bring your authorization to test from the Department of Health (since you won't have a Certificate of Completion)

# Now to Address Other Eligible Candidates

Other eligible candidates will use the same 4 steps, but in a different order. Again, these other eligible candidate include:

- E2: Nursing Program Student or Graduate (LPN or RN program)
- **E3**: Military Nursing Student
- E4: OUT-of-STATE Nursing Assistant Graduate or Nursing Program Student or Graduate
- o **E5**: Lapsed Nursing Assistant
- o **E7**: Trained Prior to Feb. 1, 2015
- E8: OBRA Re-Activation

o **E9**: Training Program Now Closed
