

## **Additional Important Information**

- 1. It is your responsibility to renew your RN license annually up to 90 days prior to your birthday regardless if you receive your renewal notice.
- 2. If you are renewing an expired credential and your license is reactivated prior to your next birthday, you will still be responsible for paying your renewal fees of the upcoming renewal cycle.
- 3. Name change requirement: If you applied for a nurse or healthcare license in Washington state through the Washington State Department of Health and have since changed your name, we require a copy of the legal name change document submitted with your application. ( such as a marriage certificate, divorce decree, or other court documents)
- 4. If your RN license has been expired for more than 3 years and you do not have an active license in another U.S. state, you will need to complete a commission approved refresher program. We will issue an LEA for you to complete the clinical portion of your refresher program after your program has notified us of completion of the theory portion.
